ALL SOULS PARISH MEMORIAL

Only the following items are allowed: Christmas card with a dollar bill, Candy bars and Snack Crackers, Chapstick, Shampoo, Socks, Combs (not rat-tail), Brush, Emery Boards, Change Purses, Playing Cards, Postage Stamps, Writing Paper, Gloves, Scarves, Knit Hats and Tissues. **Please no not include hard candy or nuts, coffee, tea or cups, glass, nail file or clippers, razor blades, shaving cream, after shave lotion, necklaces or jewelry, sharp objects, mirrors, shower caps, pencils, pencil sharpeners, tweezers or scissors or plastic bags.**
